# MEETING OPEN TO PUBLIC COMMENT:

*P. Dibble:* questions the noise ordinance and states it's not enforceable, having issues with neighbor.

*L. Eckhardt:* will have to look into it since it is a law the Town passed.

*F. Manning:* questions the board on why he can't move into a home he put a deposit on back in November over a personal vendetta.

Discussion between T. Hanson and Deputy CEO Cassavaugh regarding the open permits and obtaining a CO, Hanson believes a Licensed Engineer is to certify the tie down and provide this not the CEO, Deputy Cassavaugh states he would research Hanson's concerns.

B. Baker and T. Hanson discuss the issue being in court on Friday where things will be determined there. N. Gardner questions the Board on how much this is costing the Town, Supervisor Eckhardt replies "A lot". N. Gardner expresses concern stating "stop this bullshit", P. Kueppers addresses N. Gardner's language towards the Board.

T. Hanson states the average cost per taxpayer this is going to cost is \$150, you are paying more now for legal fees then what it cost to run the library, states the board needs to come to a resolution and he'll drop the litigation. Supervisor Eckhardt asks what resolution would that be, Hanson is not entirely sure something of equal terms. No action taken.

S. Demick brings up concerns regarding the music events held at Gardner's with the noise levels and the drug presence it brings to Town. Supervisor Eckhardt asks how many arrests were made, N. Gardner responds 200 most of them were out of town coming into town, Gardner comments that it was a good turn out "a couple calls and one dead guy". Suggestions made to have the event holder bring/hire police presence at the gates to be checked at each event. Board agrees this is a good suggestion. Fractal Fest is the next event held on July 12-15<sup>th</sup>.

Update to Celebrate Stephentown Event going as scheduled, have about 20 people for the "Made in Stephentown" event scheduled. Councilman Jennings talks about a Town Clean-Up day with himself and Hwy. Superintendent Goodermote. Transfer Station is Okay to except the garbage picked up during the Clean-up, Councilman Roder makes suggestion on contacting Matt Hagrady from the State to see if a permit is needed for State Hwy clean up. Youth Commission update on summer program, Steve Ricardi likes the program Stephentown offers and asked Berlin Board to sponsor their youth to come to Stephentown, Berlin Board was not happy declined, and are not holding a summer program this year. Councilman Roder is concerned with population but it is something to discuss. Applications are coming in and are due by the 30<sup>th</sup> for camp.

Councilman Roder gives update on Comprehensive Planning Committee, Monday June 25<sup>th</sup> at 7pm Public Hearing on Draft Plan it will be located at the Town Hall.

Town Board closes public comment, opens meeting back up for discussion between board and passing resolutions.
