TOWN CLERKS REPORT: The Town Clerk turned over the sum of \$358.37 to the Supervisor for the month of **APRIL 2023**.

JUSTICE COURT REPORT: The distribution from the office of the State Comptroller, Justice Court Fund to the Town of Stephentown for the month of **February 2023 was \$554.00 and March 2023 was \$1,231.00.** The month of **January 2023** was **\$1,783.00 and April was \$1,731.00.**

TRANSFER STATION REPORT: The Transfer Station deposited a total of \$ 7,626.00 for the month of **APRIL 2023.**

Stickers: \$160 Appl. & Electronics: \$130 Propane Tanks: \$130

Council Jennings: reported a break in at the Transfer Station on 5/4/2023. Someone threw a rock through the window and entered through the window. We do not left money in the cash drawer so no money was stolen. They riffled through the file cabinet and stole approximately \$15.00 in tips. And approximately 25 bags. Sherriff's took a report. Commissioned Alex to fix the window, and we are back in business. UPDATES to price increases. On June 1st recyclables will cost the Town \$105.00/ton. ERCSWMA put out BIDS and County Waste was the lowest bidder, they will be taking over June 1st. We will be paying more for recyclables than garbage removal (\$75.00/ton). We are expecting a new vendor for electronic. Tires have increased to \$5.00/tire. Board needs to have a discussion on when we will implement increases. Transfer Station may run itself out of business if the costs are too high.

Supervisor Roder: agrees there are concerns with increases. Reported the Highway Department turned over \$210.00 for Scrap metal.

MEETING OPEN TO PUBLIC COMMENT:

T. Dormady: thanked the highway department for cleaning up Nora Way, expressed concerns of garbage being dumped on Whitman Road.

HWY Superintendent Goodermote: reported that the highway crew will be up to clean up the mess.

Council Jennings: expressed concerns that if prices continue to increase we will see more trash around town.

T. Dormady: asked about getting security cameras at the transfer station.

Council Jennings: considered this, however there are no internet services at the transfer station at this time. We would have to install fiber, and it is costly.

R. McClave: here on behalf of the fire department and ambulance billing. Provided a history of the fire department response team. \$221,000 presently is spent from the Fire District Budget. 2 Ambulance services are currently not allowed to bill are Hoag's Corners and Stephentown. Currently going through a tedious process to allow Stephentown to bill for ambulance services. The ambulance had 235 patients last year, over 9,000 miles, transports to three states, provided 18 mutual aids, there was 76 ALS intercepts. If we do not start billing by January 2026, ALS services will start billing us. This would be \$23,000 to \$25,000 annually. The bill prohibits to bill the uninsured. We will bill those who have insurance in hopes to off set some of the funds.

 $\textit{Supervisor Roder: agrees that there have been financial struggles and long-term problems with \textit{EMS County wide.} \\$

Council Jennings: asked if any other "outfits" were going through the same issues.

R. McClave: yes, \$3,000 is not reasonable, we are looking at \$900, Priority 1 is who we are working with.

Council Jennings: will the funds coverall EMS services or will the Fire District fund some of the costs?

R. McClave: reported that this was a loaded question. The hope is that the funds would be able to fund EMS completely unsure what it will look like. Waits are long at the hospitals, and ALS and EMS are short staff.

Supervisor Roder: mentioned that the Fire District budget has not changed in a while.

R. McClave: noted 9 or 10 years since the last increase in budget.

Supervisor Roder: asked if there was anything the Board could do to assist in helping with the process.

R. McClave: reported not at this time, but the Board would be the first to know.

J. Peabody: provided a monthly Fire Department call report, 19 EMS with transportation, 3 without transport, 1 mutual aid received, 1 provided, 1 vehicle fire, 2 wires down, 1 special. 103 Year to date calls. The Helicopter drill will be this Saturday at 10:00am. Burn Ban Ended, reminder that a burn permit is required through Code Enforcement to burn.

K. Roppolo: Youth Commission update: have only had 5 counselors apply this year. Have two applicants for assistant director. Jessica Rontay has decided to stay as Director this year. Working on scheduling trips and programs. The Camper Application will be out in June. Raised prices for the out of town campers to \$100/week or \$400 for the entire program. Swimming lessons will still be taking place as well. In Pittsfield, MA. Teen Night will be Friday. Library Update: Logan will be at the library at 6:00pm tomorrow for a program, June 17th Sherriff's Dept Drug Take Back Program, 10am-2pm Summer reading kick off and Reptile Show. 5/23 Alzheimer's Disease program will take place. Still looking for recommendations for the Scholarship of \$2,000. Resume, recommendations and an essay to apply for the scholarship. Veteran's now have a page on the Library Website.

Council Jennings: makes a recommendation for a camp trip at the Community Forests, Albert Community Forest on Hayes Road and Ingall's Reserve on Horse Haven. Beautiful locations and trails. Contact the Rensselaer County Plateau Program they have a Youth Program to get the youth interested and involved, and it's free.

J. Peabody: August 6th New Resident Welcome Brunch, everyone is welcome to attend.

M. Van Horn: does Stephentown have a Community Compost for food waste?

Council Jennings: something to look into, concerns of the bears and other wildlife.

Assessor VanDeusen: Grievance day is 5/23, The Fire Department needs to pass a resolution to get exemptions
