- Any disruptive conduct will be addressed at any meeting if the Town Board is willfully disrupted by a person or by a group of persons so as to render the orderly conduct of the meeting impossible. The Chair (Town Supervisor) may recess the meeting or order the person, group or groups of persons willfully disrupting the meeting to leave the meeting or to be removed from the meeting. Disruptive conduct includes addressing the Board without first being recognized, not addressing the subject before the Board, repetitiously addressing the same subject, failing to relinquish the podium when requested to do so, or otherwise preventing the Board from conducting its business.

Discussion regarding Hazardous Waste Day, announced 2024 Clean up day will be held on June 7th. Council Clark and Madden received requests again for 911 signs. Supervisor Roder requested a meeting to see what the 911 signs would cost and logistics of the project. Supervisor Roder requested that people not throw their garbage on the sides of the road, he has had several complaints on the matter.

J. Peabody provided an update on the Library, the roadside clean up will not be taking place this year, they were not able to pull it off. Annual meeting this Sunday at 12pm. Youth Commission update – Easter event was a success 80 kids and 80 adults in attendance, Teen Night was a success, a family volunteered to share their Asian culture and make food and watch a movie. Discussion on a location on the Summer Youth program, they fire hall is looking like it id going to be the place this year. However, discussion of bad weather and use of the Fire Hall was a concern. Supervisor Roder suggested the use of the Town Hall if there was bad weather or a conflict for them to utilize the Fire Hall. New legislation requires summer youth programs to have an AED. Looking to have community training on CPR and AED.

J. Peabody provided the Fire Alarm Report for the month: total of 34 calls for the month and 72 YTD calls. There are 2 new EMTs and 3 more who will be taking the written exam.

Highway Superintendent Goodermote reported that the recent storm did not cause too much damage, noted only one road where no one resides had some issues.

Assessor Van Duesen mentioned Grievance Day will be held on May 28th this year.

Town Clerk Hoffman provided an update on the annual ARPA reporting, new filing requirements and all funds need to be committed to a project by the end of the year and reported out during this filing term. Copier update – National Business lease was up and we have had some communication issues. We will be going with a new company who is local and will provide a SHARP copier under state bid pricing which is less than what we are currently paying.

Supervisor Roder reported that he has received the check for the truck replacement.

**Resolution 25 of 2024** Support of the Road Stream Crossing Survey Evaluation and Prioritization

**WHEREAS, the** Trout Unlimited team has been working with the Town of Stephentown to develop a Road Stream Crossing Management Plan for the Town of Stephentown that is designed to help improve

community and ecosystem resiliency by identifying high priority road stream crossing replacement projects that reconnect high quality aquatic habitat and improve community flood resiliency and road infrastructure condition within the Town; and

**WHEREAS**, the scope of the project included an inventory of all state, county, town and private road stream crossing, aquatic passage and hydraulic modeling of the data, prioritization of results using multiple objectives and the development of conceptual and shovel ready designs and cost estimates for highest priority projects, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town will utilize this survey evaluation and prioritization for the following main purposes: first, to have plans for priority culvert replacements; second, to have the inventory data available for future culvert replacement planning; and additional benefits will include having the inventory available for potential grant opportunities related to culvert replacements and for environmental considerations, and

**WHEREAS**, the Town desires to incorporate this survey evaluation and prioritization in any long-term road maintenance plans and in considering standards for new roads and driveways and to also provide a resource for the Highway Superintendent and Town Board with identifying and prioritizing future projects and annual budgets; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board intends to make the Road Stream Crossing Management Plan available on the Town's official Website as well as to incorporate the Plan in future updates of other Town plans and policies including the Town's Comprehensive Plan as the Town Board deems appropriate;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Town Board of the Town of Stephentown fully supports and approves the project performed by Trout Unlimited and will make use of the results of the project in the form of a Road Stream Crossing Management Plan as stated aforesaid.
